Definitions

- "Number of Students Who Began the Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancellation period.
- "Students Available for Graduation" is the number of students who began the program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 100% of the published program length within the reporting calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program length (includes on-time graduates).
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "Graduates Available for Employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates Unavailable for Employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United States or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates Employed in the Field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documented verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six months period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after a student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Graduates Taking Exam" is the number of graduates who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.
- "First Available Exam Date" is the date for the first available exam after a student completed a program.
- "Passage Rate" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported licensing exam.
- "Number Who Passed First Available Exam" is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- "Salary" is as reported by graduate or graduate's employer.
- "No Salary Information Reported" is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.



STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL

You have the right to cancel this enrollment agreement and obtain a refund of charges paid through your attendance based on the refund chart below. Students may cancel and receive a full refund for charges paid through the first week of class instruction, or the seventh day after enrollment, whichever is later. (Pursuant to Ed. Code \S 94911(e)(1),(2),(3)

CANCELLATION POLICY

Cancellation shall occur when you have given written notice of cancellation to the School, at the physical address of the School, or by the email shown on the top of the first page of the Enrollment Agreement. You can do this by mail, hand delivery or email. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail, is effective on the postmark date when deposited in the mail properly addressed with postage prepaid.

The written notice of cancellation need not take any particular form and, however expressed, is effective if it shows that you no longer wish to be bound by this Agreement.

If the school has given you any equipment, including books or other materials, you must return them to the school within 24 hours following the date of your Notice of Cancellation. If you fail to return this equipment, including books and other materials, in good condition the school may deduct its documented cost from any refund that may be due to you. Once you pay for the equipment, it is yours to keep without further obligation.

If you cancel this Agreement, the school will refund any money that you paid less any deduction for equipment not timely returned in good condition **within forty five (45) days after your Notice of Cancellation** is received. STRF, application, registration, and security fees are non-refundable.

WITHDRAWAL FROM COURSE

You have the right to withdraw from the course of instruction at any time. If you withdraw after a period allowed for cancellation of the Agreement (within the first week of instruction), the School will remit a refund based on the below refund example chart. All refunds will be processed within forty five days (45) following your withdrawal. STRF, application, registration, and security fees are non-refundable. You are obligated to pay only for educational services rendered and for unreturned equipment.
